Renée Crichlow, MD, FAAFP

Dr. Renée Crichlow is a full-spectrum family medicine physician on faculty at the University of Minnesota. She is the director of advocacy and policy for the University of Minnesota Department of Family Medicine and Community Health and the current President of the Minnesota Academy of Family Physicians. Dr. Crichlow attended medical school at University of California, Davis. Following residency, she completed her first fellowship in faculty development (clinical research focus) at the University of California, San Francisco. Dr. Crichlow then joined the faculty at UC Davis with a joint appointment in family medicine and OB/gynecology. Following UC Davis, she worked and taught as a family physician and lived in rural Montana while on faculty with the University of Washington in the Montana Family Medicine Residency Program. Dr. Crichlow's experience in health policy includes completing a fellowship in primary care health policy with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. She joined the University of Minnesota Department of Family Medicine and Community Health in 2009. Dr. Crichlow is the co-founder of a youth health career mentorship program in North Minneapolis called The Ladder, which has been engaging learners and physicians at every level. Dr. Crichlow also has extensive experience in teaching health policy, community engagement and leadership in addition to her full-spectrum practice.
